Why have a Quilt Show? Our mission statement states that "our guild is to preserve the art of quilt making, stimulate & encourage interest through educating members and the community."

One of the responsibilities of guild membership is to support putting on the quilt show every other year.

There are all kinds of jobs to be done from planning the show, putting up the show & working the show. It is a wonderful sight to see a plain old gym transformed into an Art Show and when the show opens, to see how it all comes alive! As a group we need everyone's help. Of course we could not even have a quilt show without everyone's quilts. There is room for every member to at least have one quilt in the show. All kinds of quilts are welcome as long as they are finished.

Prior to the show date we will have a master hourly time sheet. Members will need to fill in all the areas that need help during the show. Each member will need to record the places and hours they are working, then make sure they arrive in time to relieve the workers before them. You can volunteer for just one area of the show or do several different jobs throughout the show. Please remember the Committee Chairs can't do it all by themselves. Please be generous with your time, so no one gets over worked. As you can see below, many members are already working on behalf of us all.

Boutique Ideas for our quilt show in March: (Any questions please see Boutique Chairs)

Baby bibs; adult bibs; lap quilts; baby quilts; full size quilts; sets of placemats; table runners; tote bags; small & large hand bags; wall quilts; sewing cases for scissors, rotary cutters, cell phones, eye glasses; pin cushions; stuffed toys for children & pets; fabric packages of 2,3,4,5 inch squares, 6" charm square packages, yardage packages, fat quarter packages; quilt books; quilt magazines tied 4-6 to package. Eighty percent of the sale goes to you and twenty percent goes to the guild.

Silent Auction info: All quilt shows have some kind of auction for members to help raise money for guild programs or charity. Some have Live Auctions but ours is a Silent Auction. Basically the only requirement for our auction is that the quilts are not to be more than 80" around. This means if you add all the sides together it can't total more than 80 inches. Usually these are mini quilts or small works of fiber art. Please, if you have time to put a sleeve on it, it will help the new owners to hang their purchases. Any quilts not sold will be returned to the maker. In past shows we've had 55 to 65 quilts donated.
